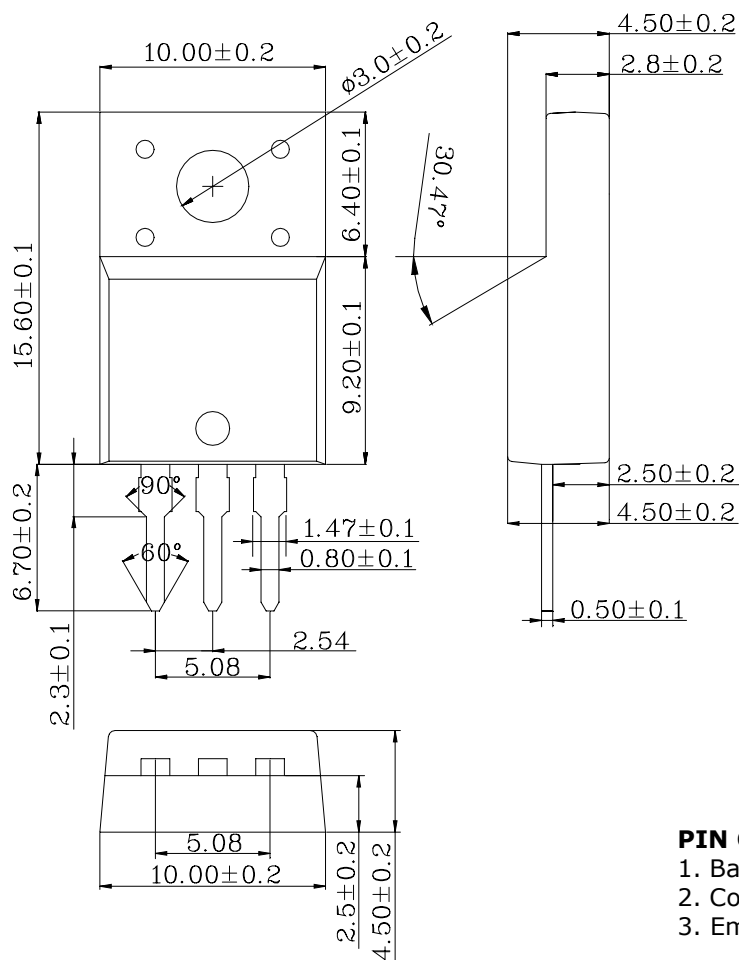

Fig. 1 $P_D - T_C$

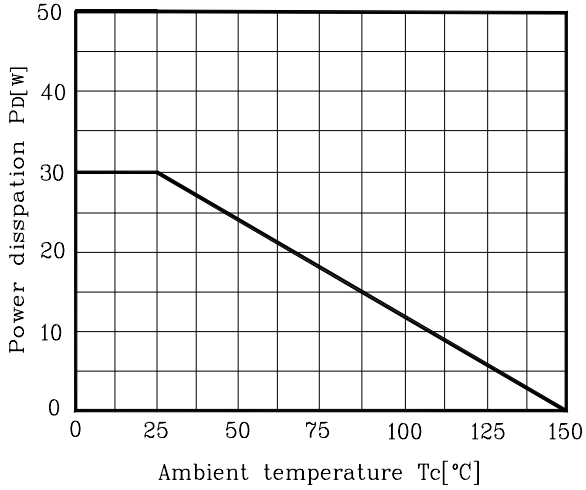


Fig. 2 $V_{BE(sat)}, V_{CE(sat)} - I_C$

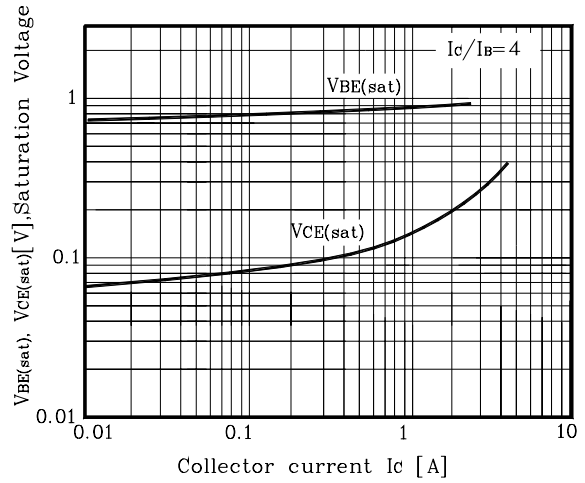


Fig. 3 $h_{FE} - I_C$

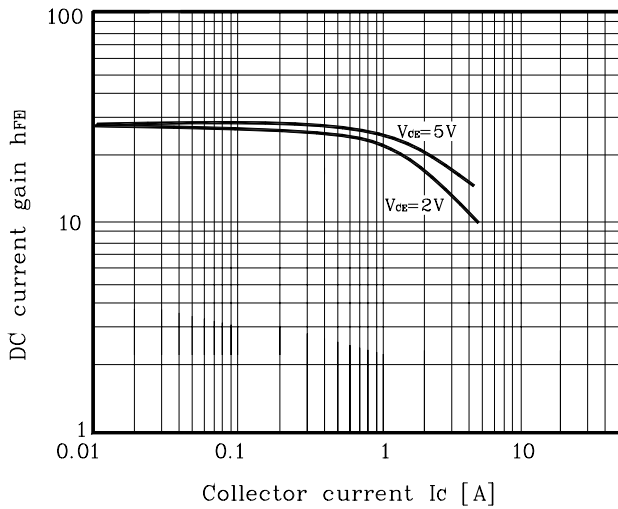


Fig. 4 Turn off time

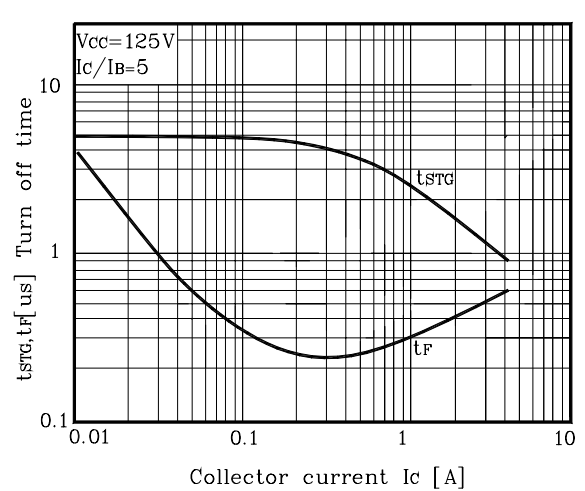


Fig. 5 Turn on time

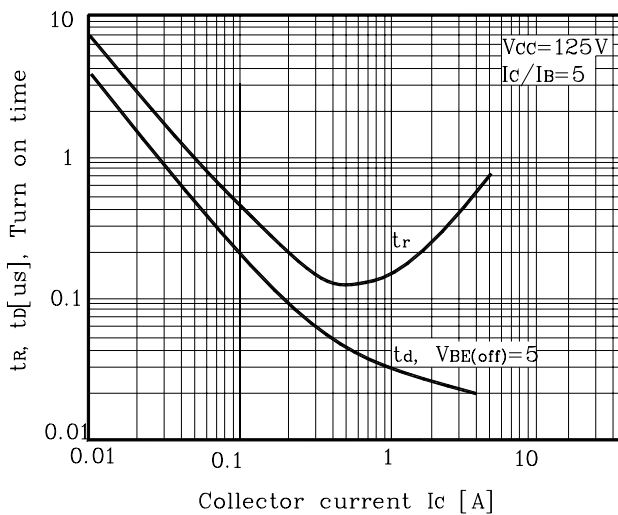


Fig. 6 Capacitance

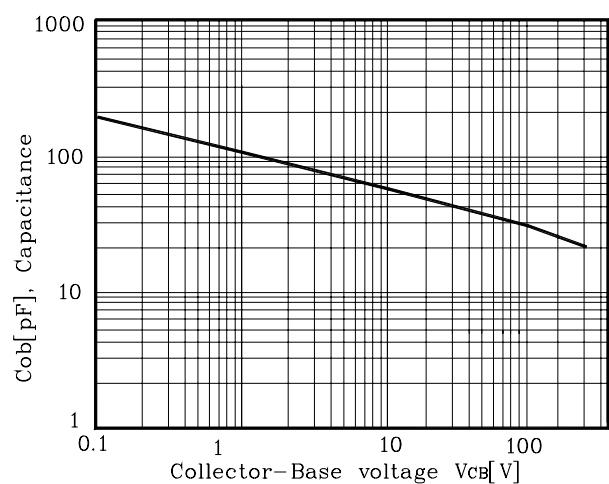


Fig. 7 Safe Operating Area
