

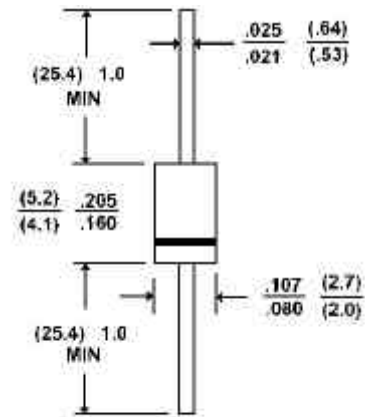

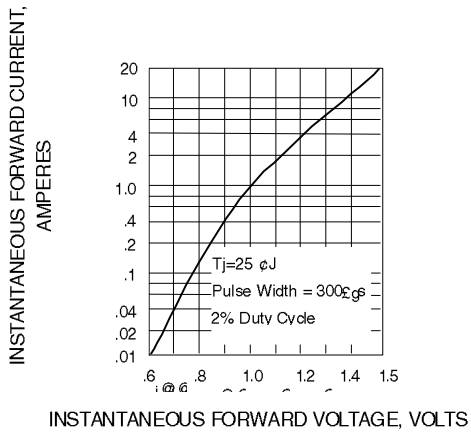


Fig. 1-TYPICAL FORWARD CHARACTERISTICS

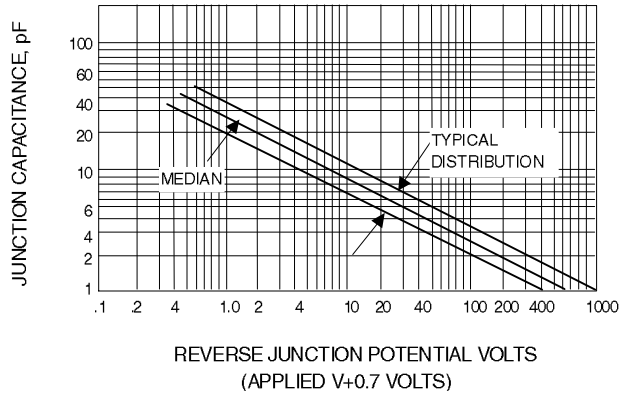


Fig. 2-JUNCTION CAPACITANCE

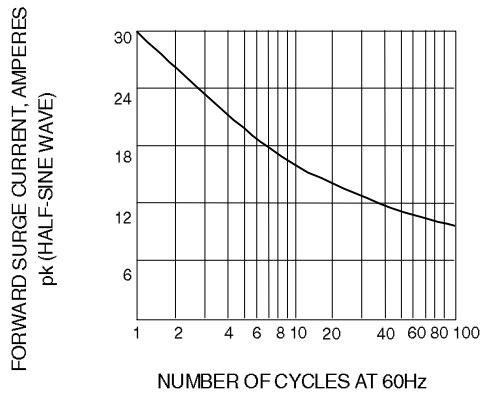


Fig. 3-PEAK FORWARD SURGE CURRENT

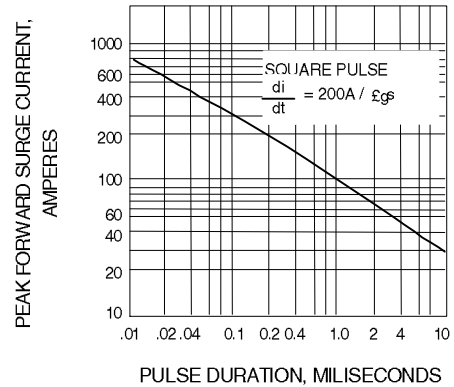


Fig. 4-PEAK FORWARD SURGE CURRENT

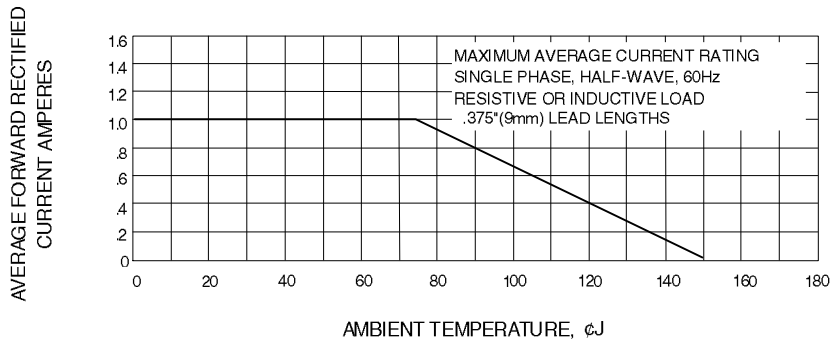


Fig. 5-FORWARD DERATING CURVE
