8Mx64 SDRAM SODIMM based on 8Mx8, 4Banks, 4K Refresh, 3.3V Synchronous DRAMs with SPD

#### GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The Samsung KMM466S823CT2 is a 8M bit x 64 Synchronous Dynamic RAM high density memory module. The Samsung KMM466S823CT2 consists of eight CMOS 8M x 8 bit with 4banks Synchronous DRAMs in TSOP-II 400mil package and a 2K EEPROM in 8-pin TSSOP package on a 144-pin glass-epoxy substrate. Two 0.1uF decoupling capacitors are mounted on the printed circuit board in parallel for each SDRAM. The KMM466S823CT2 is a Small Outline Dual In-line Memory Module and is intended for mounting into 144-pin edge connector sockets.

Synchronous design allows precise cycle control with the use of system clock. I/O transactions are possible on every clock cycle. Range of operating frequencies, programmable latencies allows the same device to be useful for a variety of high bandwidth, high performance memory system applications.

Pin	Name	Input Function
CLK	<i>System clock</i>	Active on the positive going edge to sample all inputs.
$\overline{\text{CS}}$	<i>Chip select</i>	Disables or enables device operation by masking or enabling all inputs except CLK, CKE and DQM
CKE	<i>Clock enable</i>	Masks system clock to freeze operation from the next clock cycle. CKE should be enabled at least one cycle prior to new command. Disable input buffers for power down in standby. CKE should be enabled 1CLK+tss prior to valid command.
A0 ~ A11	<i>Address</i>	Row/column addresses are multiplexed on the same pins. Row address : RA0 ~ RA11, Column address : CA0 ~ CA8
BA0 ~ BA1	<i>Bank select address</i>	Selects bank to be activated during row address latch time. Selects bank for read/write during column address latch time.

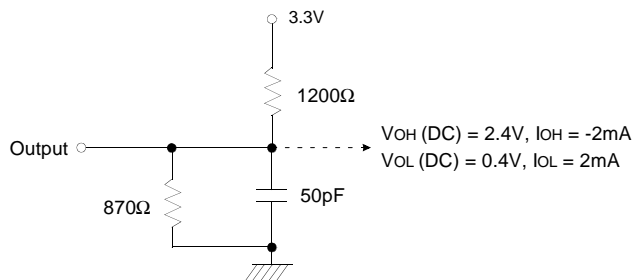

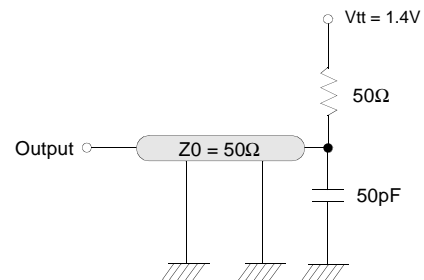

A<sub>0</sub> ~ A<sub>11</sub> & BA<sub>0</sub> ~ BA<sub>1</sub> : Program keys. (@ MRS)

2. MRS can be issued only at all banks precharge state.

A new command can be issued after 2 clock cycles of MRS.

3. Auto refresh functions are as same as CBR refresh of DRAM.

The automatical precharge without row precharge command is meant by "Auto".

Auto/self refresh can be issued only at all banks precharge state.

4. BA<sub>0</sub> ~ BA<sub>1</sub> : Bank select addresses.

If both BA<sub>0</sub> and BA<sub>1</sub> are "Low" at read, write, row active and precharge, bank A is selected.

If both BA<sub>0</sub> is "Low" and BA<sub>1</sub> is "High" at read, write, row active and precharge, bank B is selected.

If both BA<sub>0</sub> is "High" and BA<sub>1</sub> is "Low" at read, write, row active and precharge, bank C is selected.

If both BA<sub>0</sub> and BA<sub>1</sub> are "High" at read, write, row active and precharge, bank D is selected.

If A<sub>10</sub>/AP is "High" at row precharge, BA<sub>0</sub> and BA<sub>1</sub> is ignored and all banks are selected.

5. During burst read or write with auto precharge, new read/write command can not be issued.

Another bank read/write command can be issued after the end of burst.

New row active of the associated bank can be issued at t<sub>RP</sub> after the end of burst.

6. Burst stop command is valid at every burst length.

7. DQM sampled at positive going edge of a CLK and masks the data-in at the very CLK (Write DQM latency is 0), but makes Hi-Z state the data-out of 2 CLK cycles after. (Read DQM latency is 2)
